At the end of the bill, add the following new section:

1	SEC. 11. SMART CITIES TRANSPORTATION PLANNING
2	STUDY.
3	(a) In General.—The Assistant Secretary of Trans-
4	portation for Research and Technology shall conduct a
5	study of digital technologies and information technologies,
6	including shared mobility, data, transportation network
7	companies, and on-demand transportation services—
8	(1) to understand the degree to which cities are
9	adopting these technologies;
10	(2) to assess future planning, infrastructure,
11	and investment needs; and
12	(3) to provide best practices to plan for smart
13	cities in which information and technology are
14	used—
15	(A) to reduce traffic congestion;
16	(B) to improve city operations;
17	(C) to grow the local economy;
18	(D) to improve response in times of emer-
19	gencies and natural disasters;

1	(E) to improve the lives of city residents;
2	and
3	(F) to reduce environmental impact.
4	(b) Components.—The study conducted under sub-
5	section (a) shall—
6	(1) identify issues that influence the ability of
7	the United States to plan for and invest in smart
8	cities, including barriers to collaboration and access
9	to scientific information; and
10	(2) review how the expanded use of digital tech-
11	nologies, mobile devices, and information may—
12	(A) enhance the efficiency and effective-
13	ness of existing transportation networks;
14	(B) optimize demand management serv-
15	ices;
16	(C) impact low-income and other disadvan-
17	taged communities;
18	(D) provide opportunities to share, collect,
19	and use data while ensuring the privacy of indi-
20	viduals;
21	(E) change current planning and invest-
22	ment strategies;
23	(F) provide opportunities for enhanced co-
24	ordination and planning; and

1	(G) provide opportunities to reduce the en-
2	vironmental impact of transportation.
3	(c) Coordination.—The study conducted under
4	subsection (a) shall include coordination with other rel-
5	evant Federal agencies conducting research on smart cit-
6	ies, including the National Science Foundation and the
7	National Institute of Standards and Technology, as well
8	as relevant State and local agencies.
9	(d) Reporting.—Not later than 18 months after the
0	date of enactment of this Act, the Assistant Secretary
1	shall publish the results of the study required under sub-
2	section (a) on a public website.
