3	(a) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE CYBERSECURITY
4	FRAMEWORK.—The Director, in collaboration with the
5	private sector, shall develop a voluntary framework that
6	includes standards, guidelines, and best practices for re-
7	ducing cybersecurity risk to critical infrastructure.
8	(b) Scope of Framework.—The framework devel-
9	oped under subsection (a) shall be a prioritized, flexible,
10	performance-based, and cost-effective approach to help the
11	owners and operators of critical infrastructure identify, as-
12	sess, and manage cybersecurity risk. The framework
13	shall—
14	(1) identify existing cybersecurity standards,
15	guidelines, and best practices that are applicable
16	across critical infrastructure sectors;

1	(2) specify high-priority gaps for which new or
2	revised standards are needed;
3	(3) include measures to protect the privacy of
4	individuals and sensitive business information; and
5	(4) provide guidance that is technology neutral.
6	(c) STAKEHOLDER INPUT.—In the development of
7	the framework required under subsection (a), the Director
8	shall seek input and advice from the private sector, includ-
9	ing critical infrastructure owners and operators, relevant
10	Federal agencies, and State, local, and tribal governments.
11	(d) TIMING OF FRAMEWORK DEVELOPMENT.—With-
12	in 18 months of the date of enactment of this Act, the
13	Director shall publish a final version of the framework.
14	(e) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE.—In this section, the
15	term "critical infrastructure" has the meaning given the
16	term in section 1016(e) of the Critical Infrastructures
17	Protection Act of 2001 (42 U.S.C. 5195c(e)).
